

PREFACE

THE first Calendar here printed was made in 1911–12 by Mr. J. Brownbill, M.A., for the Library, Museum and Arts Committee of the Liverpool Corporation, with whose consent and support it is now printed by the Society. The second Calendar, printed in the Appendix, has been made by Miss Kathleen Walker for the University of Liverpool School of Local History and Records, under the circumstances mentioned below.

The Moore Deeds and Papers, to use general terms, were a large collection of original deeds, documents, papers and letters, chiefly relating to the Lancashire, Cheshire, and other properties, and the affairs, of the ancient and once-powerful family of Moore of Bankhall, Co. Lancaster.¹ From Colonel John Moore (d. 1650), one of the Commissioners for Ireland, and Sir Edward Moore, Bt. (d. 1678), (the writer of the Moore Rental, edited in 1899 by Mr. W. Fergusson Irvine, M.A., F.S.A., under the title of Liverpool in King Charles II's Time), the documents passed to Sir John Moore² (d. 1702) of Appleby Parva, Co. Leicester, and of Kentwell Hall, near Long Melford, Suffolk. Sir John, who was Lord Mayor of London in 1681, was, so far as can be ascertained, no relation to the Moores of Bankhall, but was a mortgagee of the estates, which explains his possession of the documents. The Kentwell Hall property seems to have passed to his nephew, John Moore of Kentwell Hall (d. 1714), and then to a great-nephew, John Mould, who assumed the name of Moore. The latter's grandson Richard (who married a daughter of Admiral Rowland Cotton, second son of Sir Lynch Salusbury Cotton of Combermere) was living at Kentwell Hall in 1812, and a little later, about 1825, Kentwell Hall seems to have been purchased by Robert Hart Logan, afterwards Deputy-Lieutenant and High Sheriff of Suffolk, and M.P. for West Suffolk in 1837. Logan died on 13th April 1838, and the collection of documents appears to have passed by inheritance to Captain James Stewart of Alltyrodyn, Llandyssil, North Wales,

whose father, Alexander, had married the eldest daughter of William Logan of Stirling.

The word "collection" used above to describe the documents must not be taken to imply that they were intentionally gathered together by any of the Moore family, though later owners appear to have added illustrations and portraits. In their origin the documents were largely the natural residue of landed estates—that is to say, deeds and documents which subsequent purchasers from the Moores' mortgagees saw no use in taking over, together with a gradual accretion of family and miscellaneous papers.

The presence of the large number of early Kirkdale, Bootle, Linacre, and Bankhall deeds can be accounted for by the probable assumption that when in 1724–5 the tenth Earl of Derby purchased those places from Sir Cleave Moore and his mortgagees, the Earl's legal advisers were satisfied to obtain possession of only the more recent title deeds, and declined to take over the others as unnecessary from a legal point of view. Such a course (which has its disadvantages) is often followed by modern conveyancers for fear of obtaining notice of some earlier defect in title or restrictive covenant, and is the explanation why many family muniment-rooms or solicitors' offices are full of ancient and valuable deeds, thus by vicissitude of fortune unfortunately severed from the property to which they relate.

Many of the Moore documents which were considered of national interest were (wholly or partly) printed in Part IV of the *Tenth Report* (1885) of the Historical Manuscripts Commission (which is referred to in the Calendars as Hist. MSS. Rep.), where Captain Stewart's MSS. are fully reported upon, occupying pp. 59–146. It was the publication of this report that first drew the attention of local antiquaries to the important nature of the collection.

In November 1901 the collection was sold at auction by Messrs. Sotheby, Wilkinson & Hodge. The sale catalogue (of which there are copies in the Liverpool Public Library and Liverpool Athenæum Library) comprised 318 lots, relating to many places in England besides Lancashire and Cheshire. The following lots, or portions of them (which covered the 1368 documents here first calendared), were purchased by the Liverpool Public Library for a total sum of $\pounds 201$, 6s. 4d. :—Nos. 29, 30, 31, 35, 39, 49, 68, 70, 71, 76, 100 to 124 inclusive, 127, 128, 129, 150 to 157 inclusive, 160 to 164 inclusive, 167, 168, 170 to 172 inclusive, 177 to 180 inclusive, 182, 183, 188, 192, 208, 211, 246, 276 to 303 inclusive, 313 to 317 inclusive. The following lots or portions were purchased for Lord Derby. They included no deeds, and are nearly all documents which refer to some member

of the Stanley family. Presumably they are now at Knowsley:— Nos. 1, 34, 55, 56, 57(?), 58, 59, 60, 61, 67, 69, 94, 98, 99, 125, 126, 158, 166, 175, 229, 252. The following lots, or parts of them (which covered the 139 documents in the Appendix), were obtained for the University of Liverpool School of Local History and Records, and are now in the School, 40 Bedford Street:—Nos. 16, 21, 23, 27, 38, 43, 81, 89, 92, 97, 101, 102, 103, 114, 137, 155, 216. The remaining lots, very few of which related to Lancashire or Cheshire, were mainly purchased by dealers, and the owners are not known.

The great importance of these Moore documents to historians of Liverpool and district has generally been recognised, and they have been made use of to some extent by several persons, notably by Mr. Irvine, in his edition of the *Moore Rental* already mentioned, and also by the editors of the *Vic*:oria History of Lancashire, in the accounts of Liverpool, Bootle, and Kirkdale.

So long ago as 1886, when the collection was still in the possession of Captain Stewart, he lent to the Historic Society of Lancashire and Cheshire a large number of the documents relating to Liverpool and district, and, by permission of the Corporation of Liverpool, Mr. T. N. Morton, their record clerk, and then Honorary Assistant Secretary of the Historic Society, made transcripts of many hundreds of the charters and documents, under an arrangement whereby both the Historic Society and the Corporation were supplied with copies, which are now in their possession. A rough list by Mr. Morton of some of the paper documents will be found in vol. xxxviii of the Transactions of the Historic Society, and copies and notes of some appear in vols. xxxix, xl, and lxi. Other MS. lists made by Mr. Morton are at the Liverpool Public Library. The Annual Report of the Historic Society for 1886 stated that the documents were being prepared for publication under the Society's auspices, but the project fell through. While Mr. Morton was at work, Sir James Picton, F.S.A., was asked by the Corporation of Liverpool to make a report upon the documents, and a draft of the first portion of his report was printed in 1888.1 It contains little or nothing of importance, except incomplete abstracts of thirty-six of the undated charters. After the purchase by the Corporation in 1901, permission was obtained for members of the University of Liverpool School of Local History to make transcripts of the charters, under the supervision of Mr. Irvine,

then Hon. Secretary of the School and of this Society, and a considerable number were made. Copies of these transcripts were supplied both to the School and to the Corporation. In 1004 the School issued particulars of a projected series of work on local history which included a volume containing abstracts and transcripts of the Moore charters. It was proposed that the volume should be edited by Miss E. K. McConnell, M.A., who had been studying the deeds and contemplated writing an essay upon the Town Field system in Liverpool and district; but, like the earlier proposals for publishing these documents, the scheme was never carried out. Thus the exact extent or nature of that part of the collection purchased by the Liverpool Corporation still remained more or less unknown to local historians ; and in 1911, with the object of making the documents accessible for reference, the Library, Museum and Arts Committee of the Liverpool Corporation engaged Mr. J. Brownbill to make short abstracts of the whole of them. In doing so, Mr. Brownbill had before him the original deed or document, together with, in some cases, the transcript and translation already referred to. When all the documents were abstracted on slips. Mr. Brownbill had completed the task for which he had been engaged. It is right, therefore, to make two matters plain. First, that at the time he made the Calendar there was no intention to print it, but only to use it, when indexed, as a means of ready reference to the items of the collection. The Calendar is therefore not made upon the principle of obviating any further reference to the original documents, but is designed to act as a guide to sources from which further information may often be obtained. Secondly, that Mr. Brownbill did not arrange the documents in the order in which they are now placed and numbered. After he had completed his Calendar, the slips were arranged at the Liverpool Public Library and were roughly classified into sections by reference to places. Each document was then numbered afresh and placed, with its appropriate transcript and translation (if any), in a similarly numbered envelope. [A record of the numbering originally assigned to each document when it was purchased by the Library (e.g. L. 42), and also of the numbering used in the lists and transcripts previously made by Mr. Morton (e.g. M. 99), has been kept, and these numbers will be found noted in the first Calendar so as to enable old references to be checked.] Under the Public Library arrangement the undated (or probably earliest) deeds were placed, somewhat unfortunately, at the end of each section, and were numbered accordingly. This will explain an arrangement which would otherwise have been different. In addition to this, some of the other documents are out

of place ; but it will be readily understood that it would have entailed serious labour, and possibly confusion, again to alter the numbering of so large a collection or to group the documents again; and it was decided to adhere, in the printing of this Calendar, to the new Library numbering, and to print the slips in the consecutive order in which they had been arranged. With the assistance of some footnotes and cross-references, it is hoped that the elaborate Index will enable every document relating to any particular place or person readily to be found. As it seemed desirable to include in the present volume as many as possible of the Moore documents, an arrangement was made with the University of Liverpool School of Local History and Records to print, in an appendix, abstracts of the 197 documents which the School had acquired, as already mentioned, at the sale in 1901. The abstracts have been made by Miss Kathleen Walker, who has also made full transcripts. For convenience of reference in this volume, the consecutive numbering has been carried on in the Appendix, but the numbers which the documents bear at the School, and the numbering in the Sale Catalogue of 1901 have been given as well. the former under the letter S and the latter under the letter C.

The hundreds of documents in this Calendar relating to LIVERPOOL provide the most valuable material extant for the study of that town, its early burgesses and its topography, in mediæval times, and the enormous number of names of witnesses to deeds which happily have been preserved are, genealogically speaking, of the highest importance. A great abundance of material is likewise provided for a study of the fourteenth-century common-field system in the Liverpool, Kirkdale, and Linacre townfields. It may be possible by a close study of these documents, to elaborate the conjectural maps of the Liverpool townfields, constructed by Mr. W. Fergusson Irvine. One such map for the fourteenth century is reproduced in Muir and Platt's *History of Municipal Government in Liverpool*, and in Professor Muir's *History of Liverpool*, whilst another, for a later date, is to be found in the large paper edition of *Liverpool in King Charles II's Time*.¹

When making use of the Moore Deeds, no one should omit to consult Mr. Radcliffe's "Calendar" of the Crosse Deeds,² which,

though not so numerous as the Moore Deeds, constitute similar valuable material for the history of fourteenth-century Liverpool. There are also forty or fifty early Liverpool deeds among the Aston Hall Charters, now in the British Museum.

The collection here calendared comprises a number of interesting documents relating to the Civil War and Interregnum, both in England and Ireland. Some of these have been printed or abstracted in the Historical MSS. Commission Report already referred to.

A glance at the table of contents will show that, besides Liverpool, there are a large number of documents relating to other places in Lancashire, chiefly in the Hundred of West Derby, such as Kirkdale, Walton, Bootle, Linacre, Litherland, &c.

Owing to marriages in the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries with heiresses of CHESTER families, the Moores acquired a large property in that city, and there are upwards of forty deeds ¹ in this Calendar which throw considerable light on Chester topography and local families.

The thanks of the Society are due to the Library, Museum and Arts Committee of the Liverpool Corporation for allowing Mr. Brownbill's Calendar to be printed, and for contributing f_{25} towards the cost thereof; also to the Chief Librarian (Mr. G. T. Shaw) for giving every facility in carrying out the work.

Owing to Mr. Brownbill's numerous engagements, it was not possible for him to see his Calendar through the press. This has been undertaken by the Hon. Secretary. Mr. Brownbill must, therefore, not be held responsible for any errors arising during that process. The Appendix has been checked by Miss Walker. Mr. Brownbill has made the Index.

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ABBREVIATIONS, &c.

For economy of space the abbreviations employed by Mr. Brownbill in his abstracts have been generally used. They are usually selfexplanatory. The following are the common forms adopted :—

Proper names, such as William, Richard, Robert, Henry, and Adam, are generally represented by their first syllable, thus—Will., Ric., Rob., Hen., Ad.

In Section I the name Liverpool is usually abbreviated to L. the second time it occurs in an abstract, unless the spelling varies.



In the Appendix, "S." indicates the numbers given to the documents at the University of Liverpool School of Local History and Records, and "C." indicates the numbering of the lot in the Sale Catalogue of 1901. 



Amongst other things, in a long document, he suggests that £4000 be raised, particularly from those whose names he mentions who have not subscribed proportionately to their estate, that 300 horses be procured, that 2000 men, who may be marched out of the county, be levied from the regiments and placed under his immediate command, that the strength of the garrisons in Lancashire be reduced, and that some course be taken to prevent further outrages by the garrison of Latham House.

Inside the above is the answer of the deputy-lieutenants, colonels, &c. Lancashire, long burdened with the charge of its own garrisons, cannot pay £4000 extra, but the deputy-lieutenants will do their utmost and will tax the men referred to by Fairfax; they refuse to allow their soldiers, "maisters of families, husbandmen," &c. raised only for the defence of the county, to be marched out of it; until Latham House be reduced, neither the places nor the numbers of the garrisons can be lessened.

Intends to go to Warrington or Ormeskirke. Desires Moore to provide means at Leverpoole for Mr. Stevenson's transportation to and from the Isle of Man. Armorial seal. Transcr. (S. 58) (C. 144). - 1404. 1644, Dec. 17. PRINTED ORDINANCE of Parliament for establishing a New Seal for the County Palatine of Lancaster, as the "Dutchy Seal" has been forcibly taken by the King's troops from Christopher Banister, vice-chancellor of the County. Transcr. (S. 59) (C. 92). (Hist. MSS. Rep. 74.)
- 1405. 1644, Dec. 17. PRINTED ORDINANCE of Parliament for ordaining Ministers in the County of Lancaster. Transcr. (S. 60) (C. 92). (Hist. MSS. Rep. 74.)
- 1406. 1644, Dec. 20. LETTER. Sir John Meldrum, Manchester, to Colonel John Moore, Governor of Leverpoole. Has written to the Committee of both Kingdoms and "to the Earles of Pembroke and Sailsburie concerning this busienesse." - 419. 1649, Dec. 22. LETTER. Dean Henry Bridgeman, Lever, to Colonel John Moore at Bankehall. - 1428. 1655, Nov. 5. LETTER. Robert Wynell to Madam Dorothy Fenwick at Mrs. Gray's house in "Jettord's Buldings." Desires payment of the small sum due to him. Transcr. (S. 83) (C. 137).

- 1429. 1655, Nov. 13. LETTER. John Wilson, Wrenbury near Hampton Court (?), to Edward Moore Esq. at Bankehall. Abuses Moore for his high and violent conduct. "Provydence lately brought to my hands your father's will whereby he taketh a Christian-like care of his debts and I hope to fynd out a way to gett my due and not onely soe butt a judgment and extent uponn all your lands wherein yt may fall out I may doe you a kyndnes worth the inherytance of the howse you make such stirr about." - 1430. 1655, Nov. 20. ACQUITTANCE by Gervas Clifton to Edward Moore Esq., of a bond for £400 made by the late John and William Moore, John Molineux and George Griffith to Sir Charles Smith, Dame Dorothy Clifton and Jarvise Clifton, in Feb. 1634/5. Witn. : John Crosse, Thomas Malbon and Richard Lancash. Transcr. (S. 85) (C. 137).
- 1431. 1655, Nov. LETTER. Elizabeth Sandford, Thomas Court, to her cosen Edward Moore Esq. at Bankhall. Congratulates him on his recovery from long sickness and hopes for his return to Ierland. Mentions Lady Jane. Armorial seal. Transcr. (S. 86) (C. 137).
- 1432. 1655/6, Jan. 26. LETTER. Major Thomas Evans, Kilkenny, to Edward Moore Esq. at Banchall. In accordance with the requests contained in Moore's letters, he has paid Jonathan Hunter £6 and Mr. William Davenport £24, 105. Desires to know Moore's mind concerning Cullaghmoore and Courtnebooly which Davenport tells him he has taken for 21 years. Mentions his wife and daughter and Mr. Blackmore. Armorial seal. Transcr. - 1433. 1655/6, Feb. 19. LETTER. Christopher Curwen, Thomas Court, to Edward Moore Esq. at Bank Hall. Letter of civility. Mentions his sisters Grace and Sandford, Lord William, Lord Fingall, Mr. Randolph Moore and Lady Marie. Desires Moore to visit them, "you will be as welcome on the Irish shore as ever Æneas was on the confines of Carthage." Armorial seal. Transcr. (S. 88) (C. 137).
- 1434. 1655/6, Feb. 19. LETTER. Gabriel Sherman, Bristoll, to John Robinson, Esq., London. Concerning deeds, appertaining to one Mr. Moore, left at Bristoll with Mr. Thomas Marsham " in the waretime." One Mr. Dale received them of Mr. Marsham and, two or three years since, sent them to Mr. John Marsham. Seal. Transcr. (S. 89) (C. 137).
- 1435. 1655/6, Mar. 6. LETTER. George Marshall, Morpeth, to Mr. John Blunt at his chamber in Clemants Inne. Has let Hallingdon, which is to be surveyed, at £114 a year to tenants who desire to have it for four years. Robert Burrous has the mill for £6, 135. 4d. a year. Mentions Mr. Edwards, Colonel Moore, Mr. Bowes, Mr.

Radclyffe and Lady Younge. Armorial seal. Transcr. (S. 90) (C. 137).

- 1436. 1656, May 16. BOND by Nicholas Fazakerley of Fazakerley for £200 to be paid to Edward More of Banckhall Esq. in consideration of the obligations which he, at Fazakerley's request, has undertaken towards Francis Lowe of Gray's Inn. Witn.: Na. Hebart. Endorsed by Edward Moore: "Mr. Fazakeley his reconezes befor Mr. Hubert, one of the Masters of Chancery, to bere me harmless." Transcr. (S. 91) (C. 137).
- 1437. 1656, June 21. LETTER. Thomas Evins, Kilkeny, to Edward Moore Esq. at Banck Hall or elsewhere. Desires a letter of attorney to act for Moore in connection with the residue of the lands to be allotted to him. The Council promises full satisfaction about the business wherein Moore, with the army, is concerned but "Collonell Warden tould mee that the Councell is resolved to measure over our land againe for thy supose wee have more then it was given us for." The writer desires to continue Moore's tenant at Courtnebooly and Cullaghmore. Suggests that Moore should obtain the assistance of Dr. Worslie, surveyorgeneral, in securing Ballifoyle as his reprisal for Cullaghmore. Colonel Warden has put in a claim on all their behalfs for 40,000 acres. Mentions Gowan, Fassaghdeymire (?) and Moore's servant Jonathan [Hunter]. Armorial seal. Transcr. (S. 92) (C. 137).
- 1438. 1656, June 26. LETTER. Henry Madockes, London, to his daughter Mary Moore. Her husband has reached them safely. As the woman at Leadenhalle can do Betty no good she is now going to Mrs. Ivee. "There is nott hopes in the left one of her eyes but the sight is wholy lost and unrecoverable and if great care be not taken itt will indanger the other, the humor will eat into her head." Mentions his wife and Jane, Mrs. Dawes, Mr. and Mrs. Story, and Mr. and Mrs. Moorewood. Transcr. (S. 93) (C. 137).
- 1439. 1656, Aug. 8. ACCOUNT of monies disbursed at Spindellston, 18s. 7d. Transcr. (S. 94) (C. 137).
- 1440. 1656, Oct. 7. LETTER. William Poe, Westminster, to Captain Edward Moore at Banckhall. The third time he has written to Moore to learn whether the latter's father's administrator and Mr. Harison received more than £60 from Mr. George Dawson who was treasurer at Haberdashers Hall. "The greatest newse hear is that our fleet have taken and sunck of the Spanish fleet cominge from the Indyes 2 shipps, one whereof hath two millions of plate and the other richly laden. The Spaniard hath lost by an earthquake in the Indyes a 200 millions of bulloyne and 11,000 Spaniards swallowed up." Armorial seal. Transcr. (S. 95) (C. 137).

- 1442. 1656, Nov. 8. LETTER. George Marshall, Morpeth, to an unnamed correspondent. Concerning eight years' arrears of rent for Temple Thornton, just purchased by Mr. John Blunt and another gentleman. Mentions Mr. Slingsbay and his lady. Endorsed: "George Marshall, Thomas Pierson." Transcr. (S. 97) (C. 137).
- 1443. (n.d., about 1656.) PETITION. Jonathan Huntter, on behalf of his master Captain Edward Moore, to "the Comitioneres for aplotment." Prays for redress because some men who had cattle on his master's land have refused to pay their contribution, and also because his master has only received 187 acres of the 360 allotted to him in Cortenaboole.

Endorsed with an order by the Committee of Assessment dated Kilkeny 25th Sept. 1656 signed by Richard Steiphens (?), Joseph Cuffe, Edward Feake, and William Webster, referring the petition to Captains Baker, Cuffe, and Campbell, and Lieut. Aston Perch.

cost yet can he never make the hows handsome nor the ayer healthy which for six munths in the year is so as none can have their health but such as live all their tyme ther from their birth, and the mote so near as they may take water in at the kitchen window." - 1446. (n.y., after 1656), Dec. 26. LETTER. Lady Cony to her cousin (evidently Edward Moore). Letter of civility. "Hopes ear long to return with safety" to her own home. Mentions a debt owed by Moore, apparently to a doctor. Mentions also Sir William, Mr. Maynard, Lady Mosley and her servant Mr. Okell. Transcr. (S. 101) (C. 137).
- 1447. 1656/7, Jan. 21. LETTER. M. C. (Lady Cony) to her cousin Mrs. Dorothy Moore at Banckehall. Has given Mr. Hansonn's bond to Mr. Blunt. Mentions her own brother, and Dorothy's cousin, Lady North and "the young aier of Bradford." Endorsed by Edward Moore : "Lady Conys leter concerning (?) a bond she gave Mr. Blont. Query." Seal. Transcr. (S. 102) (C. 137).
- 1448. 1656/7, Jan. 23. LETTER. George Marshall, Morpeth, to Edward Moore at Bankhall neare Livurpoile. Concerning the rents of Hallingdon and Scrymerston. By Mr. Radclyffe's directions, has let Thornton to the present tenants for another year at £75. Mentions Mr. Robert Fenwick. Transcr. (S. 103) (C. 137).
- 1449. 1656/7, Feb. 11. LETTER. Major John Foxe and W. Case, Liverpoole, to Edward Moore of Bankhall Esq. They wish to confer with him at Mr. Williams'. Armorial seal. Transcr. (S. 104) (C. 137).
- 1450. 1657, May 9. LETTER. J. Blount to Edward Moore Esq. att Bankhall neere Liverpoole. Been unable to reply to Moore's letter of 20 April. Proposed sale of Hallington and Scrymerston to Mr. Bushell. "The Lord Protector did yesterday refuse to accept the kingly government and the army remonstrated against itt, and desyred the House to desist any further proposals therein. What effect it will work tyme must manifest." Transcr. (S. 105) (C. 16). (Hist. MSS. Rep. 108.)
- 1451. 1657, Aug. 24. CONVEYANCE. Edward Moore of Banckhall Esq. to his creditors John Blount of the Middle Temple, gent., and Edward Bushell, gent., of his wife, Dorothy Fenwick's third part of the manor of Scrimerston and certain of its appurtenances (tenants and boundaries named), valued at £1350, the overplus to be paid to Moore. Thomas Greene of Scrimerston, gent., deputed to deliver seisin. Signed by F. Radcliffe, Ralph Emerson, Nicholas Carnaby, and J. Blount. Armorial seal. Transcr. (S. 106) (C. 16). (Hist. MSS. Rep. 108.)
- 1452. (n.d., about 1657.) LETTER. J. H. to Edward Moore Esq. at Banckhall. Apparently concerning a sale or lease of land.

Refuses Moore's offer, contained in his letter of the 8 inst., of \pounds 500, and in a few days will send him his ultimatum about the matter. "The thing troubles me is I doubt the hand of Joab is in the thinge—that is to say some of the Leverpools leven of designes and there I am unwilling any excise jackdaw should roust after I am gonn." The letter contains much general news, particularly about Ireland and foreign affairs. The writer rejoices to hear of "soe many brave soules mett att hunting in yours parts; there loyall soules are not disturbed with thoughtes of plotts but sure the Presbiterian zeale is moved to se it." If this offer is refused, he will purchase instead 700 acres, of which he is now tenant, from "an adventurer at London." Fragment of armorial seal. Transcr. (S. 109) (C. 16). (Hist. MSS. Rep. 108.)
- 1455. 1659, June 20. LETTER. Edward Rigby, Preston, to his kinsman Edward Moore Esq. "at the Banckhall neer Leverpoole." Has perfected the draught of Moore's bill which he now sends together with the "fower papers or writting" mentioned in Moore's letter. Asks that the bill, with the addition of "any other allegations," may be quickly returned for ingrossing. Armorial seal. Transcr. (S. 110) (C. 16).
- 1456. 1659/60. Jan. 19. LETTER. Thomas Rigby, Rossall (?) to his nephew Edward Moore at Bankhall. Desires a renewal of her lease to the bearer whose husband, an "honest man, helpfull to all, hurtfull to nonne," has just died. Seal. Endorsed with some names and figures. Transcr. (S. 111) (C. 16).
- 1457. 1659/60, Jan. 20. LETTER. James Johnson of Hawkshead Hall in Furnes Fells to Edward Moore Esq. att Bankehall neare Liverpoole. Desires a lease of 40 or 50 acres at Carleton for three lives. Mentions "the other busines in Ireland." Transcr. (S. 112) (C. 16). (Hist. MSS. Rep. 108.)
- 1458. 1659/60, Jan. 21. LETTER. Thomas Rigby, Poolton, to his nephew Edward Moore Esq. "at his house Bankehall." Pleads for a favourable lease for the bearer, William Salthouse, who has had a disagreement with Moore but is now "willing to be ruled" by him. Armorial seal. Transcr. (S. 113) (C. 16).
- 1459. 1659/60, Jan. 21. LETTER. Thomas Rigby, Poolton, to his nephew Edward Moore Esq. Bankchall. Urges Moore to "a

favourable aspect" towards those of his tenants at Poolton, under Rigby's charge, who have not abused his patience, "amongst whom this bearer is the chiefe." Transcr. (S. 114) (C. 16).

- 1463. 1663, Oct. 20. LETTER, signed Roger Bradshaigh, F. Rawstorne, William Banks, to the constables of Kirkdall and their assistants, Thomas Higinson and John Bancks. Orders them to collect, and pay to John Hartley of Strangewayes, High Collector for the Hundred of Darbye, certain sums of money from Edward Moore, John Syre and George Higginson. Seals. Endorsed by John Hartley: "Paid in full £5, 12s." at the house of Robert Murrey in Wigan. Endorsed by Edward Moore: "The aquitance for the first two subsidies I paid in King Charles II time, signed by Sir Roger Bradshaw, Mr. Rostren and Mr. Bankes, three justices, to Mr. Hartley colictor." Transcr. (S. 118) (C. 21).
- 1464. 1663, Nov. 27. LETTER. John Blundell to Edward Moore Esq. at his house at Banckhall. About an enclosed letter (now missing) from "my brother Penington." Armorial seal. Transcr. (S. 119) (C. 97). (Hist. MSS. Rep. 111.)
- 1465. 1663/4, Jan. 18. LETTER. G. Irelande and Thomas Norres to Edward Moore Esq. at Banck Hall. Have not made any award in the business between Moore and Mr. Blackmoore because they are credibly informed that the latter is dead and "the other partys fact" is apparently not so criminal as his. Armorial seal. Endorsed by Edward Moore: "Sir Gilbert Ireland and Mr. Norrice letter about young Blackmore. Vide one other from Ireland here." Transcr. (S. 120) (C. 97). (Hist. MSS. Rep. 111.)


- 1466. 1663/4, Feb. 16. LETTER. Peter Johnson, Everton, to his brother-in-law William Mercer, "livinge in Lynaker." Hears that Mercer repudiates the deed given by both himself and his father to his brother John Hey and the writer. They look for a true performance of the bargain. Endorsed by Edward Moore: "Richard Mearser fefe in trust his letter." Transcr. (S. 121) (C. 97).
- 1467. 1664, May 30. RECEIPT and RELEASE. John Harison of Netherton, yeoman, acknowledges receipt of £330 from Edward Moore of Bankhall in payment for a messuage &c. near Ryce Lane, Walton, purchased by Moore the previous 28 Jan. and now released by Harison. Witn.: Thomas Moore, Percival Hoolme, Richard Booden, Thomas Chapman. Examined at "the execucion of a comission at Liverpoole" 4 Jan. 1669/70 by (signatures) L. (?) Adlington, Peter Marsh, Perch. (?) Borron, John Franckland. Transcr. (S. 122) (C. 97).
- 1468. 1664, Oct. 25. LETTER. John Blundell, Grayes Inn, to Edward Moore of Bankhall Esq. at his howse neare Liverpoole. Has received £50 from Mr. Sturmy, besides the other ten. Has ordered John Laithwaite to take Moore's bond to Bankhall and to receive the other £40 with the interest. Endorsed by Edward Moore: "Mr. John Blundell letter. I bought Richisin (?) teniment of him." Transcr. (S. 123) (C. 97).
- 1469. (n.d., 1664.) LETTER. F. L. to Sir John Moore. The letter is addressed to Sir John, who has been appointed, amongst others, to inspect the accounts of the Chamber of London, on account of his "unparrelled fidelity to monarchicall government." The writer, a deputy for one of the wards in London, accuses various other deputies of embezzling public money. Endorsed : "Aboute arrears of assessments for fifteenthes 1664." Transcr. - 1470. 1665, Oct. 16. LETTER. John Winstanley to Raph Farneworth at the Pro-notories office in Preston. On legal business connected with Mr. Moore. Desires Moore, if necessary, to distrain on Mrs. Harper and Rigbye will then "give satisfaction." Endorsed by "Wm. Shⁿ." who mentions that Alderman Thomas Willomson wishes to confer with Moore. - 1474. 1672/3, Jan. 25. LETTER. Robert Clive, Stych, to Edward More. In answer to More's letter of the 22 Jan. desires him to pay his debt by the middle of the term. "I wish you a happy end of all your troubles, for you will find much more comfort to enjoy a smaller estate free from engagements then a greater with many incumbrances." Armorial seal. Transcr. - 1475. 1673, May 10. LETTER. Robert Clive, Stych, to Edward More, London. Mentions More's letter of 1st April and reproaches him for his continued failure to settle his debt to the writer in spite of his re-iterated promises of payment. Transcr. (S. 130) (C. 43).

- 1478. 1676/7, Mar. 5. LETTER. Sir Edward More to Lady More at Sir John More's house in Mincen Lane, London. - 1479. 1677/8, Mar. 4. LETTER. Sir Edward More to Sir John More. Desires Sir John to ask the captains of the ships "Eagle" and "Massingborke" for the money due to the writer. Mentions his cousin Francis More. Is informed that "the Strats flet," with goods for him, worth over £1000, is in the Downes. Endorsed with short list of the "Eagle's" cargo. Armorial seal. Transcr. (S. 134) (C. 43).
- 1480. 1678, July 10. LETTER. Sir Edward More, Parish, to Sir John More at his house in Mincen Lane, London. His journey to France was at two hours' notice. Intends to start next Thursday for Dipe on his homeward way and hopes soon to see Sir John. "The generaly of the people here are for peace with England and warre with all the world besides." Transcr. (S. 135) (C. 43). (Hist. MSS. Rep. 129.)

- 1481. (n.d., XVII Cent.) LETTER. John Vaughan to Mr. Madox, cheese-monger, King's Street, Wesmester, London. Gives a list of the grooms of the Beadchamber. The narrative deals chiefly with the movements of James II and concludes abruptly with William of Orange's decision to connive at his flight to France because "he was made to believe that neither the King's death nor imprisonment would help him to the crown so soon as his escaping . . ." Transcr. (S. 139) (C. 216).



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

I. That the Society shall be called the RECORD SOCIETY, and shall have for its object the transcribing and publishing of Original Documents relating to the Counties of Lancaster and Chester.

2. That the affairs of the Society shall be governed by a Council consisting of a President and twelve Members, the former of whom shall be *annually* elected by the Council.

3. That three Members of the Council shall form a quorum.

4. That the subscription of Members of the Society shall be \pounds 1, 15. per annum, which shall entitle them to the publications for the year; but any Member whose subscription shall be two years in arrear shall thereupon be removed from the Society, and shall not be re-admitted until all arrears have been paid. The number of Members is limited to 350.

5. That the subscriptions shall be due in advance on the 30th of June in each year, and that no work shall be issued to any Member whose subscription is in arrear.

6. That an Annual Meeting of the Society shall be held in the month of October, of which due notice shall be sent to all the Members. At this meeting a Report of the work of the Society, with a Statement of the Income and Expenditure, shall be presented. These shall be annually published, together with a List of Members and the Rules of the Society.

7. That so long as the funds of the Society permit, two volumes at least shall be issued to the Members in each year.

8. That no copies of the publications of the Society shall be sold to non-members, except at an increased price to be fixed by the Council.

9. That no payment shall be made to any person for editing any work for the Society, but that the Editor of each Volume shall be entitled to ten copies of the work so edited by him.

10. That the Treasurer's Accounts shall be audited by two Members of the Society, who shall be elected at the Annual Meeting.

11. No alteration shall be made in any of the above Rules except at the Annual General Meeting. Notice of any proposed alterations must be sent to the Hon. Secretary a month before such General Meeting.

12. That a meeting of the Council of the Society shall be called by the Hon. Secretary at least once in every three months.

RECORD SOCIETY OF LANCASHIRE AND CHESHIRE

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1912-13 (35TH YEAR)

Read at the Annual Meeting held in the Audit Room of the Chetham Hospital, Manchester, on the 19th day of October 1913.

DURING the year ending 30th June 1913 two volumes have been issued to the Members. Volume 65 was Part V. of the series of Marriage Licences for Cheshire and South Lancashire covering the years 1661 to 1667, and was edited by Mr. W. Fergusson Irvine, M.A., F.S.A. Volume 66 was an Index to the Lancashire Wills proved within the Archdeaconry of Richmond from 1793 to 1812 inclusive. The previous calendars of Richmond Wills issued by the Society came down to 1792, and the permission of the President of the Probate Division of the High Court of Justice was obtained to continue the list to 1812. The volume also included Wills proved in the Peculiar of Halton during the same period, and was edited by Lieut.-Col. Henry Fishwick, F.S.A.

During the year an arrangement was made with the Library Committee of the Liverpool Corporation to print a Calendar of the Deeds and Papers of the Moores of Bankhall, Co. Lanc., which had been made by Mr. John Brownbill, M.A., for the Committee. The Moore collection was sold by auction in 1901, and about fourteen hundred important documents, relating to Liverpool and many other places in the Hundred of West Derby and to Chester, were purchased by the Liverpool Corporation. They date from the thirteenth century, and include hundreds of charters. The Library Committee agreed to contribute f_{25} towards the cost of printing. An arrangement was also made with the University of Liverpool School of Local History and Records to include in the volume a calendar of about 140 further documents from the same collection which the School had acquired at the sale in 1901. This Calendar has been made by Miss Kathleen Walker. It is hoped that the Volume will be issued in the forthcoming year.

Mr. Irvine has another volume (Part VI.) of Marriage Licences (1667–1680) ready, and it only awaits the Index.

Mr. Brownbill has completed the editing of the Ledger-Book of Vale Royal mentioned in last year's Report, and it is in the press.

Owing to the illness of the transcriber, Miss Stokes, it has not been possible to make progress with the Lancashire and Cheshire Star Chamber Proceedings.

A successful protest has been made by the Society during the year against the removal from Somerset House to York of the Lancashire portion of the Wills proved at Richmond. The circumstances have been dealt with in the Introduction to Volume 66. The Wills are to remain in London.

As a result of the Report of the Royal Commissioners upon Public Records, a private Bill has been introduced into the House of Commons providing for the establishment of a Welsh Record Office, and the removal to it of all Welsh Records. The probable

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effect of the Bill, as originally drafted, would have been to include amongst the Welsh Records to be sent from the Public Record Office to Wales, many of the records of the County Palatine of Chester, and also to separate the Flintshire Records from those of Cheshire, although that county was for administrative, judicial, and financial purposes dependent upon the County Palatine, certainly until the sixteenth century. Attention was drawn by the Honorary Secretary to the objectionable nature of the provisions of the Bill, and the matter was vigorously taken up by the Cheshire County Council, with the view that no records relating in any way to Cheshire or its dependents should be transferred to Wales. After prolonged negotiations with the promoters of the Bill a clause drafted for the Cheshire County Council by Mr. Henry Taylor, F.S.A., of Chester, and the Honorary Secretary, was accepted, under which all records of whatever date relating in any way to Cheshire, and all records relating to the County of Flint before 1543, are excluded from the provisions of the Bill. Local historians and antiquaries are much indebted to the Cheshire County Council for its energetic and effective action.

During the year ending 30th June 1913, one new Member has joined and six have died or resigned. The number of paying Members then stood at 150. The Honorary Treasurer's accounts show a balance in hand on 30th June 1913 of \pounds_{157} , 75. 8d.
