LANCASHIRE PAPISTS' ESTATES, 1717-1788. VOLUME II. 1717

INTRODUCTION

THE first volume of the returns of Lancashire Papists under the Act of 1715 contained those enrolled on Register Rolls I, II and part of III. This second volume contains the rest of roll III and the whole of roll IV. There remain two rolls for 1717 and one each covering 1718–1723, 1723–1725, 1723–1740, 1739–1749, 1748–1776 and 1782–1785.

The same conventions of presentation used in the first volume have been followed in this, viz.: all leases are for three lives, the number of those in being only are given, and the lessor is the person registering the estate; any exceptions are stated. Personal names and place-names are printed as in the original. Among the registers now printed those of the following do not appear in Estcourt and Payne's *The English Catholic Nonjurors of 1715*: John Belasyse, Edward Browne, Alice and John Duxbury, John and Thomas Dwerryhouse, Robert Malbon, John Stanley and George Woods.

Much of the interest of the returns of papists' estates lies in the light which is cast upon agricultural conditions—such as enclosure, boon services, rents paid by sub-tenants, etc. Reference is made to enclosure at Blackburn, Eccleston, Longton, Ramsgreave, etc., while boon services appear on nearly every page.

Holt, in his General View of the Agriculture of Lancashire, 1795, states that "many farms are held by leases on three lives, on which a fine has been paid, and a small annual rent received; and sometimes an addition of boon services; which last system seems much on the decline." Some twenty years later Dickson, in his volume of the same title, writes that "the rent of lands in this county is almost invariably paid in money... and it seldom occurs that any services are stipulated for.... In a very few instances a little team-work is, however, required, for the drawing of fuel, etc."

In 1717, however, boon rents and services were the rule rather than the exception, for in comparatively few instances do the registers mention a straight rent or an additional sum "in lieu of boons." The boons and services were of great variety as the following examples shew:—

Boons: 1-12 hens, $\frac{1}{2}$ -4 capons, 4-66 eggs, 1 aughendale (7 quarts) cockles, $\frac{1}{2}$ peck mussels, 1-12 geese, 2 moorcock and 11-21 fat young ducks.

Services: $\frac{1}{2}$ -10 days reaping, keeping a dog or hound or beagle or spaniel, $\frac{1}{2}$ -5 days harrowing, 1-3 days mowing, leading 1-40 loads turf, leading 1-2 loads or 3-102 baskets of coal or cannel, reaping $\frac{1}{2}$ -1 ac. oats or barley, ploughing, harrowing and reaping $1\frac{1}{2}$ r-1ac., keeping a fighting cock, "Service in the Kings Warrs," I day leading dung, 1-4 days filling [spreading] dung, $\frac{1}{2}$ -3 $\frac{1}{2}$ days ploughing, delving 1-20 loads turf, $\frac{1}{2}$ -4 days delving turf, making $\frac{1}{4}$ -3 ac. hay, 2 days leading dung or marl, 1 day weeding corn, 3 days stacking turf, 1 day guttering, 4-12 days making hay, 6 days leading marl, 1 day leading hay, bringing 2 sacks of moss, leading $\frac{1}{2}$ -1 load charcoal, leading 1 load slates, harrowing and weeding $\frac{3}{4}$ ac., providing a saddle-horse to London, keeping a cockle-carriage, warning tenants to do boons and services, carrying hens, 1 day leading clay, ditching 3 r. and ploughing $\frac{1}{4}$ -1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ac.
